

- (2) Educate the community and enlist support and participation of all citizens concerning these needs.
- (3) Design, promote, or implement services to fill these needs, or coordinate present existing services in the community.
- (4) Promote and support any other programs that are designed to assist elderly programs in the community.

The Council on Aging shall cooperate with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Office of Elder Affairs.

Section. 2-128. State and Federal Legislation.

The council on aging shall be cognizant of all state and federal legislation concerning funding, information exchange, and program planning which exists for better community programming for the elderly.

The Council on Aging shall give an Annual Report to the Board of Selectmen with a copy of that report directed to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Office of Elder Affairs.
