Committee has not met in 1 year. Scott and Paul will both be sticking with it.


Scott to inform Town Manager that board wishes to become 5 members instead of 7.

Paul to go to Gorettis and ask about plastic bag recycling.



Discussion- re meeting night


Present members decided Monday is still best night, except Melinda would prefer Thursday.

Discussion-


Can not hang out around transfer station to talk with people about recycling. Already to many instances for issues with people walking around/slowing things down.

Next meeting to be scheduled in a couple of months when more issues arise. Members will be notified by email/phone.



Meeting called to order at 6:30 pm

Scott introduced packet of tonnage for past 5 years.

Paul had question regarding final sentence of committee charge and wanted to make it clear that we focus on education.

Rob McNeil went over numbers, recycling is about at capacity of what can be handled with out creating more trips, and more expense, for hauling. He also went over the failed plan for the reworking of the transfer station. Suggested we get into the schools to get students on board and bring that enthusiasm home. Hauling charge will be going done July 1 to \$125 per load. The town should expect a rebate from Wheelabrator in the amount of approximately \$80,000 this fiscal year. He feels that the people that are recycling will continue and that those that aren't on board will need some serious prodding. He also indicated that food waste may be the next item to be mandated to be removed from the trash stream. Another area that he felt people were unaware of is that textiles of most kind can be recycled.

Bob Spain indicated we should look into what the private haulers are doing, if anything, with regards to recycling.

Mary changing from emphasis on glass to textiles.

Jeff made motion to adjourn, Gregg seconded, unanimous.

Scott did a "Is this recyclable?" presentation to give each member an idea of what to present to the public in the future.


